We offer a wide range of academic and technical programmes that lead to university, employment or an Apprenticeship.

T Level Programmes

T Levels are two-year courses designed with businesses and combine college learning with a substantial industry placement. These qualifications are for students who want to develop knowledge and skills which help them get straight into employment, an Apprenticeship or higher education, and are equivalent to three A Levels.

Vocational Courses

Our vocational courses include BTEC and NCFE CACHE qualifications.

A BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma is equivalent to three A Levels A* - C. BTECs are nationally recognised, work related qualifications that give you the knowledge, understanding and skills that you will need to progress to University, an Apprenticeship or employment.

Technical Courses

Technical courses are industry-specific and offer training at a variety of levels. They provide the knowledge and practical skills needed to progress into further study, skilled employment or Apprenticeships.
