More about the course

Have you thought about a career in nursing, working with adults and building your skills in industry alongside studying on campus? Whether you're thinking about a future in healthcare support or working with the ambulance service, this T-Level in Supporting the Adult Nursing Team could kickstart your career in this rewarding industry.

On this two-year course you will benefit from learning in our industry-standard facilities that replicate real hospital wards and health suites. Learning from industry-experienced tutors you will study a range of important topics, such as health and safety regulations, scientific and clinical practice, and infection prevention, as well as theoretical studies of biology, chemistry and physics. You will complete the course

with the scientific knowledge and practical experience you need to make a real difference as an important contributor to the adult health industry.

You will also undertake an employer industry placement for a minimum of 45 days throughout your course, giving you the opportunity to put your new skills into practice and thrive in the workplace.

Entry Requirements

- You will ordinarily require a minimum of 5 GCSEs at Grade 5 or above, including English, maths and science.
- You may also be required to participate in an assessment to ensure suitability ahead of enrolment.

What will I achieve?

On successful completion of this course, you will achieve a NCFE Level 3 T-Level in Health (Supporting the Adult Nursing Team).

What will I learn?

You will study the following core modules:

- Working within the health and science sector
- The healthcare sector
- Health, safety and environmental regulations in the health and science sector
- Health and safety regulations applicable in the healthcare sector
- Managing information and data within the health and science sector
- Managing personal information
- Good scientific and clinical practice
- Providing person-centred care
- Health and wellbeing
- Infection prevention and control in health specific settings
- Safeguarding
- Core science concepts
- Further science concepts.

You will also complete an occupational specialism component (Supporting the Adult Nursing Team).

Alongside your studies you will undertake a substantial work experience placement of at least 45 days.

Work Experience opportunities

Work experience is an important part of your T-Level. You will undertake a substantial industry placement with an employer for a minimum of 45 days during your course to help you prepare for your next steps. You will also undertake an employer-set project as part of the course.

English and maths

English, maths and digital skills are vital to all roles in health and these are embedded throughout the course to help you prepare for working in the industry.

Where can I progress?

On successful completion of this course, you may progress into industry on an apprenticeship or a variety of entry-level roles including an ambulance support worker or a healthcare support worker. Alternatively, you can progress into higher education.
